## Rules

1. Enter the names of the players, maximum of 4 players or 4 teams of players.
2. Roll the number of dice shown under the handicap heading in the top right of the score card.
3. Enter the total of the dice rolled for the handicap in the column next to the players names.
4. In turn roll the number of dice for each hole, either 1 or 2 depending on the par or length of the hole.
5. Enter the number rolled in the Score column
6. Take away the number of shots for that hole depending on handiap and stroke index (see below).
7. Write down the number of points in the points column for the nett score. 5 for an albatros, 4 for eagle, 3 for birdie, 2 for a par, 1 for a bogey and 0 for double bogey or worse (See below).
8. After all players have completed 9 holes add up the total number of points and put in the total row.
9. The winner is the player with the most points.

### Points scoring examples

A handicap of 7 would get 1 shot deducted from holes with stroke index 1 to 7,

A handicap of 16 would get 2 shots decuted from holes with stroke index 1 to 7 and 1 shot deducted from holes with stroke index 8 to 9.

#### Example 1.

With a handicap of 14, the player rolls a 5 on hole 8 (par 4, stoke index 4) they would get 2 shots deducted from their score giving them a nett 3 birdie and 3 points.

#### Example 2.

With a handicap of 12, the player rolls a 5 on hole 8 (par 4, stoke index 4) they would get 1 shot deducted from their score giving them a nett 4 par and 2 points.
